Training

Training: Basic Safety Training - 5 days

Basic Safety Training (BT): is an STCW training course required of all mariners. Course topics include: Personal Survival, Firefighting, First Aid, Personal Safety Frequency: Every Five years

Training: Vessel Personnel with Designated Security Duties – 1 day

Vessel Personnel with Designated Security Duties (VPDSD) is an STCW training course required of all mariners.

Course topics include: Vessel Security

Frequency: One time only

Application

Application: Apply for a Transportation Worker Identification Card

A TWIC is a federal ID card required of all merchant mariners. You will need your card to apply for your MMC, and later to access terminals and port security.

Frequency: Every Five years

Your primary care provider can perform the physical and complete USCG Form 719K/E (entry level) The drug test will need to be completed by a USCG approved provider along with USCG Form 719P

Application: Apply for your Ordinary Seaman Merchant Mariner Credential

An Ordinary Seaman is the entry level rating for Merchant Mariner Credentials (MMC). Your MMC is valid for five years. Upon completing training and acquiring seatime, you can upgrade your MMC rating.
